A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Vehicle Laws - Young Drivers - Driving Privileges

3 FOR the purpose of altering the period after which the holder of a learner's instructional permit may take certain examinations for a provisional license 4 5 under certain circumstances; altering the period for which a learner's instructional permit is valid; repealing exceptions in law allowing an individual 6 7 who is at least a certain age to drive on Maryland highways without obtaining a learner's instructional permit; altering the hours during which a holder of a 8 provisional driver's license under a certain age may drive unsupervised; 9 10 requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to impose certain restrictions on a provisional driver's license and suspend or revoke the license under certain 11 circumstances; altering a certain definition; modifying a certain license 12 13 restriction prohibiting a holder of a provisional driver's license from driving a vehicle carrying certain passengers under certain circumstances; and generally 14 relating to driving privileges for young drivers. 15

11 12 13	(d) (1) If the Administration receives satisfactory evidence that an individual has violated this section, the Administration may suspend or revoke the individual's driver's license.
14 15	(2) An individual may request a hearing as provided for a suspension or revocation under Title 16, Subtitle 2 of this article.
