Vehicle Laws - Young Drivers - Driving Privileges <u>Learner's Instructional</u> <u>Permits</u>

- FOR the purpose of altering the period after which the holder of a learner's 4 instructional permit may take certain examinations for a provisional license 5 6 under certain circumstances; altering the period for which a learner's instructional permit is valid; repealing exceptions in law allowing an individual 7 8 who is at least a certain age to drive on Maryland highways without obtaining a 9 learner's instructional permit; altering the hours during which a holder of a provisional driver's license under a certain age may drive unsupervised; 10 requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to impose certain restrictions on a 11 provisional driver's license and suspend or revoke the license under certain 12 circumstances; altering a certain definition; modifying a certain license 13 restriction prohibiting a holder of a provisional driver's license from driving a 14 vehicle carrying certain passengers under certain circumstances; and generally 15 relating to driving privileges for young drivers learner's instructional permits. 16

27	another state to drive vehicles of the class then being driven by the holder of the
28	provisional driver's license; and
29	(iii) Is seated beside the holder of the provisional driver's license.

1	(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, a holder of a
2	provisional driver's license who is under the age of 18 years may not drive a motor
3	vehicle with a passenger under the age of 18 years.
4	(3) The prohibition under paragraph (2) of this subsection:
5	(i) Shall be in effect from the date the provisional license is
6	originally issued until the [151st day after the provisional license was issued]
7	PROVISIONAL LICENSEE REACHES THE AGE OF 18; and
8	(ii) Does not apply to a passenger who is:
9	1. A spouse, daughter, son, stepdaughter, stepson, sister,
10	brother, stepsister, or stepbrother of the licensee; or
11	2. A relative of the licensee who resides at the same
12	address as the licensee.
13	(b) A police officer may enforce this section only as a secondary action when
14	the police officer detains a driver for a suspected violation of another provision of the
15	Code.
16	(e) A violation of this section is a moving violation for the purposes of §
17	16-402 of this article.
18	(d) (1) If the Administration receives satisfactory evidence that an
19	individual has violated this section, the Administration may suspend or revoke the
20	individual's driver's license.
21	(2) An individual may request a hearing as provided for a suspension
22	or revocation under Title 16, Subtitle 2 of this article.
23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
24	October 1, 2008.
