1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Safety - Emergency Management - Essential Goods and Services

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from selling or offering to sell certain goods or services for a certain price during a state of emergency; prohibiting a person 4 5 from selling or offering to sell certain services for a certain price during a state 6 of emergency and for a certain amount of time following a state of emergency; 7 creating a certain exception; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to 8 provide a person an opportunity to present evidence that a price increase was 9 not unlawful; providing that a certain sale or offer for sale is an unfair or 10 deceptive trade practice; altering a certain definition; defining certain terms; 11 and generally relating to the sale of goods or services during or following a state of emergency. 12

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
