4 FOR the purpose of providing that the Department of General Services has full police jurisdiction and authority for the enforcement of certain laws as they relate to 5 6 certain properties, including the surrounding areas of certain properties in 7 Annapolis; expanding the authority of the Secretary of General Services with 8 regard to the Department's police and security force and with regard to its 9 responsibility for law enforcement for certain properties, including the 10 surrounding areas of certain properties in Annapolis; repealing a provision 11 relating to the concurrent authority of the Secretary of General Services and certain chiefs of police; and generally relating to the jurisdiction, authority, and 12 responsibility of the Department of General Services Police. 13

  17 Article, the Secretary may appoint and remove superintendents to supervise
