## AN ACT concerning 1

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## Commission to Study the Impact of Immigrants in Maryland

FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission to Study the Impact of Immigrants in 4 Maryland; providing for the membership and duties of the Commission; requiring that certain members appointed to the Commission reflect certain diversity of this State; providing for the designation of a chair of the Commission; requiring the University of Maryland, College Park to provide staff for the Commission; prohibiting members of the Commission from receiving 9 compensation; authorizing a member to receive certain reimbursement; 10 requiring the Commission to report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; 12 and generally relating to a Commission to Study the Impact of Immigrants in 13 Maryland.
