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- FOR the purpose of requiring an entity, including the University of Maryland Medical System, to have a certificate of need before the entity purchases, leases, merges with, or closes a hospital in a certain county; and generally relating to certificate of need requirements for the purchase, lease, merger, or closure of certain hospitals.

- 18 **SUBSECTION, A** certificate of need is not required to close any hospital or part of a

- 22 hospital files notice of the proposed closing or partial closing with the Commission[;

- 1 (2)For a hospital located in a county with fewer than three hospitals, 2 within 30 days after receipt of the notice of intent to close, the hospital, in consultation with the Commission, holds a public informational hearing in the county where the 3 hospital is located] NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION 4 5 OR THIS SUBTITLE, AN ENTITY, INCLUDING THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND 6 MEDICAL SYSTEM, SHALL HAVE A CERTIFICATE OF NEED BEFORE THE ENTITY 7 PURCHASES, LEASES, MERGES WITH, OR CLOSES ANY HOSPITAL OR PART OF A 8 HOSPITAL IN A COUNTY WITH FEWER THAN THREE HOSPITALS.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 June 1, 2008.
