## Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council; providing for the appointment, membership, terms, and duties of the Council; 4 5 providing for the appointment of the cochairs of the Council; providing for the staffing for the Council; requiring the Council to work with the State 6 7 Department of Education regarding the granting of school credit for Council service; requiring the Council to hold certain public meetings, conduct certain 8 9 public hearings, propose legislation, and conduct a public awareness campaign; 10 providing that a member of the Council may not receive compensation as a member of the Council, but is entitled to certain reimbursement; requiring the 11 Council to make an annual report to the General Assembly; defining certain 12 13 terms; and generally relating to the Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council. 14
