## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council; 3 providing for the appointment, selection, membership, terms, and duties of the 4 5 Council; establishing an executive board; providing for the selection of the 6 executive board; requiring the consideration of certain factors in the 7 appointment or selection of certain members by certain persons; providing for 8 the appointment of the cochairs of the Council; providing for the development of 9 a certain initial application and application process; providing for the staffing for the Council; requiring the Council to work with the State Department of 10 Education regarding the granting of school credit for Council service; requiring 11 the State Department of Education and the Marvland Higher Education 12 Commission to notify certain individuals of the creation of the Council for a 13 certain purpose; requiring the Council to hold certain public meetings, conduct 14 certain public hearings, propose legislation, and conduct a public awareness 15campaign; providing that a member of the Council may not receive 16 compensation as a member of the Council, but is entitled to certain 17 reimbursement; requiring the Council to make an annual report to the 18 Governor and the General Assembly; defining certain terms; and generally 19 relating to the Maryland Legislative Youth Advisory Council. 20
