7 8 9	WHEREAS, The State of Maryland recognizes the tremendous dedication and sacrifice of those men and women who served in the armed forces and their willingness to defend the freedoms that we as individuals hold dear; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, This legislation was inspired by the untimely death of Eric Kavanagh, a 20-year-old soldier and resident of Maryland, who was killed in action in Iraq on September 20, 2006, during Operation Iraqi Freedom, and dedicated to every man and woman in our armed forces who died protecting our country; and
14 15	WHEREAS, We believe that special honor should be given to those brave soldiers and surviving family members; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, We also believe that it is imperative to protect the dignity of those who have fallen while serving this great country and that no individual, group, or organization should profit from the commercial use of a fallen soldier's name; and
19 20	WHEREAS, It is fitting that the State of Maryland enact legislation to ensure that the privacy of these heroic soldiers be respected and maintained; now, therefore,
