## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Calvert County - Alcoholic Beverages

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain alcoholic beverages license fees in Calvert County; 4 imposing certain requirements for restaurants in the county for which certain 5 Class B licenses have been issued; creating a special beer and wine tasting 6 license in the county; providing for an annual fee, application procedures, and 7 certain requirements for the license; specifying certain conditions under which a 8 protest to a renewal of an alcoholic beverages license in the county may occur; 9 altering the time during which a penalty may be imposed for late renewal of an 10 alcoholic beverages license in the county; imposing a certain fine for the sale of 11 alcoholic beverages to an underage individual in the county; altering the salaries for the chairman, members, and alternate member of the Calvert 12 County Board of License Commissioners; making certain stylistic changes; and 13 14 generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Calvert County.
