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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Children in Informal Kinship Care Relationships**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a superintendent of schools of a county to allow a child  
4 to attend a public school in a school attendance area other than the school in the  
5 school attendance area where the child is domiciled with the child's parent or  
6 legal guardian if the child lives with a relative in the school attendance area in  
7 an informal kinship care relationship due to a serious family hardship; and  
8 generally relating to children who live with relatives who provide informal  
9 kinship care due to a serious family hardship.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Education**

18 7–101.

19 (a) All individuals who are 5 years old or older and under 21 shall be  
20 admitted free of charge to the public schools of this State.

1           (b)   (1)   Except as provided in § 7–301 of this title and in paragraph (2) of  
2 this subsection, each child shall attend a public school in the county where the child is  
3 domiciled with the child’s parent, guardian, or relative providing informal kinship  
4 care, as defined in subsection (c) of this section.

5           (2)   Upon request and in accordance with a county board’s policies  
6 concerning residency, a county superintendent may allow a child to attend school in  
7 the county even if the child is not domiciled in that county with the child’s parent or  
8 guardian.

9           (3)   If a child fraudulently attends a public school in a county where  
10 the child is not domiciled with the child’s parent or guardian, the child’s parent or  
11 guardian shall be subject to a penalty payable to the county for the pro rata share of  
12 tuition for the time the child fraudulently attends a public school in the county.

13           (4)   Nothing in this section alters the requirements for out-of-county  
14 placements contained in § 4–122 and Title 8, Subtitles 3 and 4 of this article or in any  
15 other State or federal law.

16           (c)   (1)   (i)   In this subsection the following words have the meanings  
17 indicated.

18                   (ii)   “Informal kinship care” means a living arrangement in  
19 which a relative of a child, who is not in the care, custody, or guardianship of the local  
20 department of social services, provides for the care and custody of the child due to a  
21 serious family hardship.

22                   (iii)   “Relative” means an adult related to the child by blood or  
23 marriage within the fifth degree of consanguinity.

24                   (iv)   “Serious family hardship” means:

- 25                           1.   Death of a parent or legal guardian of the child;
- 26                           2.   Serious illness of a parent or legal guardian of the  
27 child;
- 28                           3.   Drug addiction of a parent or legal guardian of the  
29 child;
- 30                           4.   Incarceration of a parent or legal guardian of the  
31 child;
- 32                           5.   Abandonment by a parent or legal guardian of the  
33 child; or

1   6.     Assignment of a parent or legal guardian of a child to  
2 active military duty.

3                                 (2)   (i)     A county superintendent shall allow a child who is a  
4 resident of this State to attend a public school in:

5   1.     [a] A county other than the county where the child is  
6 domiciled with the child's parent or legal guardian if the child lives with a relative  
7 providing informal kinship care in the county and the relative verifies the informal  
8 kinship care relationship through a sworn affidavit; **OR**

9   2.     **A SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AREA OTHER THAN THE**  
10 **SCHOOL IN THE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AREA WHERE THE CHILD IS DOMICILED**  
11 **WITH THE CHILD'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN IF THE CHILD LIVES WITH A**  
12 **RELATIVE PROVIDING INFORMAL KINSHIP CARE IN THE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**  
13 **AREA AND THE RELATIVE VERIFIES THE INFORMAL KINSHIP CARE**  
14 **RELATIONSHIP THROUGH A SWORN AFFIDAVIT.**

15   (ii)   1.     The affidavit shall be accompanied by supporting  
16 documentation of one or more serious family hardships and, where possible, the  
17 telephone number and address of any authority who is legally authorized to reveal  
18 information which can verify the assertions in the affidavit.

19   2.     The supporting documentation required under  
20 subsubparagraph 1 of this subparagraph shall be consistent with local, State, and  
21 federal privacy and confidentiality policies and statutes.

22                                 (3)   The affidavit shall include:

23   (i)     The name and date of birth of the child;

24   (ii)    The name and address of the child's parent or legal  
25 guardian;

26   (iii)  The name and address of the relative providing informal  
27 kinship care;

28   (iv)   The date the relative assumed informal kinship care;

29   (v)    The nature of the serious family hardship and why it  
30 resulted in informal kinship care;

31   (vi)   The kinship relation to the child of the relative providing  
32 informal kinship care;

33   (vii)  The name and address of the school the child previously  
34 attended;

1 (viii) Notice that the county superintendent may verify the facts  
2 given by the relative providing informal kinship care in the affidavit and conduct an  
3 audit of the case after the child has been enrolled in the county public school system;

4 (ix) Notice that if fraud or misrepresentation is discovered  
5 during an audit, the county superintendent shall remove the child from the county  
6 public school system roll; and

7 (x) Notice that any person who willfully makes a material  
8 misrepresentation in the affidavit shall be subject to a penalty payable to the county  
9 for three times the pro rata share of tuition for the time the child fraudulently attends  
10 a public school in the county.

11 (4) The affidavit shall be in the following form:

12 (i) I, the undersigned, am over eighteen (18) years of age and  
13 competent to testify to the facts and matters set forth herein.

5 (viii) The county superintendent may verify the facts contained in  
6 the foregoing affidavit and conduct an audit on a case-by-case basis after the child  
7 has been enrolled in the county public school system. If the county superintendent  
8 discovers fraud or misrepresentation, the child shall be removed from the county  
9 public school system roll.

10 (ix) I solemnly affirm under the penalties of perjury that the  
11 contents of the foregoing are true to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.

16 (x) Any person who willfully makes a material  
17 misrepresentation in this affidavit shall be subject to a penalty payable to the county  
18 for three times the pro rata share of tuition for the time the child fraudulently attends  
19 a public school in the county.

20 (5) (i) Instructions that explain the necessity for both an affidavit  
21 and supporting documentation of the serious family hardship resulting in informal  
22 kinship care shall:

23 1. Be attached to affidavit forms that comply with  
24 paragraph (4) of this subsection; and

25 2. Include language encouraging the relative providing  
26 informal kinship care to submit the affidavit and supporting documentation prior to  
27 September 30 of each year.

28 (ii) The affidavit forms, with attached instructions, shall be  
29 made available free of charge at the offices of each county board of education, each  
30 local department of social services, and each local area agency on aging.

31 (6) If a change occurs in the care or in the serious family hardship of  
32 the child, the relative providing informal kinship care for the child shall notify the  
33 local school system in writing within 30 days after the change occurs.

34 (7) (i) An informal kinship care affidavit may be filed during a  
35 school year.

1 (ii) The relative providing informal kinship care shall file an  
2 affidavit annually at least 2 weeks prior to the beginning of the school year for each  
3 year the child continues to live with the relative because of a serious family hardship.

4 (8) Unless the court appoints a guardian for the child or awards  
5 custody of the child to someone other than the relative providing informal kinship  
6 care, the relative providing informal kinship care shall make the full range of  
7 educational decisions for the child.

8 (9) The relative providing informal kinship care shall make reasonable  
9 efforts to inform the parent or legal guardian of the child of the informal kinship care  
10 relationship.

11 (10) The parent or legal guardian of a child in an informal kinship care  
12 relationship shall have final decision making authority regarding the educational  
13 needs of the child.

14 (d) Section 4-122.1 of this article shall apply to the education funding of a  
15 child in an informal kinship care relationship if the fiscal impact of the requirements  
16 of subsections (b) and (c) of this section exceed 0.1% of a county board's total operating  
17 budget for a fiscal year.

18 (e) (1) By the 2007-2008 school year, each county board shall provide  
19 full-day kindergarten programs for all kindergarten students in that county.

20 (2) In the comprehensive master plan that is submitted under § 5-401  
21 of this article, a county board shall identify the strategies that will be used in that  
22 county to ensure that full-day kindergarten programs are provided to all kindergarten  
23 students in that county by the 2007-2008 school year.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
25 October 1, 2008.
