16 17	Because of another's race, color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, or national origin, OR BECAUSE ANOTHER IS HOMELESS, a person may not:
18	(1) (i) commit a crime against that person;

20 21	(iii) deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt to deface, damage, or destroy the real or personal property of that person; or
22 23	(iv) burn or attempt to burn an object on the real or personal property of that person; or

5 6 7	(1) because a person or group of a particular race, color, religious belief, sexual orientation, or national origin, OR BECAUSE A PERSON OR GROUP THAT IS HOMELESS , has contacts or is associated with the building; or
8 9 10	(2) if there is evidence that exhibits animosity against a person or group, because of the race, color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, or national origin of that person or group OR BECAUSE THAT PERSON OR GROUP IS HOMELESS .
