- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**SENATE BILL 145** Except as authorized under subsection (b) of this section, goods [and (a) services] of Maryland Correctional Enterprises may not be sold on the open market. (b) (1) Goods EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, GOODS [and services] of Maryland Correctional Enterprises may be sold on the open market: (1)**(I)** if they are produced or provided by an individual on parole or in a work release program; (2)**(II)** if the sale is made to a charitable, civic, educational, fraternal, or religious agency, association, or institution for its own use and not for resale within 1 year of the purchase; (III) to a person for national defense purposes if not prohibited by <del>(3)</del> an act of Congress; (IV) if they are surplus goods remaining after meeting the (4)forecasted requirements of units of State government and political subdivisions and the goods remain unsold 1 year after being produced; (5)**(V)** for use by a contractor or subcontractor in performance of a contract with a unit of State government or any other governmental unit in the State; as allowed under the Private Sector/Prison Industry  $(\mathbf{6})$ (VI) Enhancement Certification Program of the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance: [or] (VII) if they are related to the preparation or distribution of food  $(\overline{7})$ or services related to agriculture or seafood processing, when the following conditions are met: <del>(i)</del> the State labor pools are diminished; and 1. 2. it has been determined that inmate labor is the (ii)available source; OR (VIII) TO AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED BY THE STATE OR A <del>(8)</del> STATE-AIDED OR STATE-CONTROLLED ENTITY.

#### 29 (2) GOODS OF MARYLAND CORRECTIONAL ENTERPRISES MAY 30 NOT BE SOLD FOR USE IN ANY POLITICAL CAMPAIGN ACTIVITY.

31SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32July 1, 2008.

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
