- sewage disposal system, or holding tank is located; requiring the a notice of lien
- 6 to be recorded in the office of the clerk for land records of Dorchester County;

- 17 (d) (1) Subject to the approval of the Administration, a local government
- or a billing authority for a water or wastewater facility may establish a program to
- 19 exempt from the requirements of this section a residential dwelling able to
- demonstrate substantial financial hardship as a result of the restoration fee.
