1 AN ACT concerning

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Wicomico County - Alcoholic Beverages Act of 2008

FOR the purpose of adding Wicomico County to the list of counties that authorize the holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license to sell malt beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed refillable containers; adding Wicomico County to the list of counties that are authorized to issue a Class 7 micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license; creating a Class B special wine license for the sale of wine for consumption off the premises; specifying certain requirements for applicants for and holders of the Class B special wine license; specifying a fee and hours of sale; specifying a maximum alcohol content for wine sold under the Class B special wine license: authorizing the Board of License Commissioners to adopt certain regulations; authorizing the Board to issue a special Class C beer, beer and wine, or beer, wine and liquor license; specifying the privileges, application requirements, fee, days of use, and other requirements for holders of the special Class C licenses; adding Wicomico County to the list of counties that, on the death of a licensee, shall issue a new license under certain circumstances to the surviving spouse, partners, or senior officer without the necessity of further proceedings for the balance of the current license year; authorizing a holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license or a Class 7 micro-brewery license to have or hold a financial interest in certain retail alcoholic beverages licenses the Board of License Commissioners to issue a Class 6 pub-brewery license or a Class 7 micro-brewery license to a holder of not more than a certain number of Class B beer, wine and liquor licenses under certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Wicomico County.
