## A BILL ENTITLED

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the penalty that may be assessed by the Motor Vehicle 4 Administration for a vehicle that is without the required security for a certain period; increasing the amount of the daily penalty that may be assessed for 5 6 violating certain vehicle security requirements after a certain period; increasing 7 the maximum penalty that may be assessed for a violation of certain vehicle 8 security requirements occurring within a certain period; repealing obsolete 9 provisions; and generally relating to penalties for lapsed or terminated security for motor vehicles. 10
