3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Maryland Higher Education Commission to
4 require a certain fee from certain institutions of postsecondary education
5 applying for certain certificates of approval; and generally relating to the
6 approval of institutions of postsecondary education.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (o) (1) **THE COMMISSION MAY REQUIRE AN APPLICATION FEE FROM**
3 **AN INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION SEEKING CERTIFICATION TO**
4 **OPERATE IN THE STATE.**

5 (2) Subject to the provisions of § 11-203 of this title, the Commission
6 may require bonds or other financial guaranties from institutions of postsecondary
7 education seeking certification or recertification to operate in the State.

9 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an institution of
10 postsecondary education may not commence or continue to operate, do business, or
11 function without a certificate of approval from the Commission.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2008.
