3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “Administration” for purposes of certain
4 provisions of law relating to child care and foster care to include certain units in
5 the Department of Human Resources to which the Secretary of Human
6 Resources has delegated certain responsibilities; and generally relating to child
7 care and foster care.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Family Law**

4 (1) the Social Services Administration of the Department; **OR**

5 (2) **ANY OTHER UNIT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT TO WHICH THE**
6 **SECRETARY OF HUMAN RESOURCES HAS DELEGATED IN WRITING SPECIFIED**
7 **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADMINISTRATION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.**

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 July 1, 2008.
