CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Veterans Behavioral Health**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing behavioral health service coordination among the
4 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the United States Department of
5 Veterans Affairs, the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs, the Maryland
6 National Guard, and the Maryland Defense Force for certain veterans of the
7 Afghanistan or Iraq conflicts; requiring the provision of certain behavioral
8 health services under certain circumstances in certain areas of the State to
9 veterans of the Afghanistan or Iraq conflicts; requiring the Department of
10 Health and Mental Hygiene to seek certain reimbursement for certain services;
11 requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to separately account
12 for certain funds; creating the Veterans Behavioral Health Advisory Board;
13 providing for the composition and chair of the Board; providing for the staffing
14 of the Board; prohibiting members of the Board from receiving compensation
15 but entitling members to reimbursement of certain expenses; establishing the
16 duties of the Board; requiring the Board to submit certain reports to the
17 Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; requiring the
18 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Board, to
19 submit a certain application for certain funds on or before a certain date;
20 requiring the Department to submit a copy of the application to the Maryland
21 Congressional Delegation and certain committees of the General Assembly;
22 providing for the termination of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally
23 relating to the behavioral health needs of veterans and their families.

8 Preamble

9 WHEREAS, Maryland has a long and proud history of commitment to military
10 service, with over 460,000 veterans who have served the nation in the armed forces;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, Maryland has over 10,000 veterans of the conflicts in Afghanistan
13 and Iraq, with 5,000 more projected to return by the end of 2008; and

14 WHEREAS, It is among the highest priorities of the State to ensure that
15 veterans returning from active service have the support, opportunities, and services
16 necessary to facilitate their smooth transition from military to civilian life, and to ease
17 that transition for their families; and

18 WHEREAS, Among the obstacles returning veterans often face are unmet
19 physical and behavioral health needs arising out of their service; and

20 WHEREAS, The psychological trauma of the war on terror, the
21 counterinsurgency, and the urban battlefield has put veterans returning from
22 Afghanistan and Iraq at particular risk of Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome and
23 related conditions, which if untreated can lead to life-long struggles with depression,
24 substance abuse, unemployment, homelessness, and suicide; and

25 WHEREAS, Estimates are that more than half of veterans of the Afghanistan
26 and Iraq conflicts return from combat zones with behavioral health problems that
27 could compromise their successful adjustment to civilian life; and

28 WHEREAS, Gaps in the availability of behavioral health services and
29 impediments to veterans’ ability to access those services, particularly in the State’s
30 rural areas, may leave serious health problems untreated and exacerbate the
31 difficulties returning veterans and their families must face; and

32 WHEREAS, The State is committed to identifying the behavioral health needs
33 and gaps in services that may exist for returning veterans, and to collaborating with
34 the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, veterans’ organizations, and others
35 to address those needs and ensure that veterans and their families receive the services
36 they require and deserve; now, therefore,

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

4 **SUBTITLE 27. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR MARYLAND VETERANS OF**
5 **THE AFGHANISTAN AND IRAQ CONFLICTS.**

7 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
8 INDICATED.

9 (B) “ADJUTANT GENERAL” MEANS THE HEAD OF THE MARYLAND
10 MILITARY DEPARTMENT.

11 (C) “BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES” MEANS MENTAL HEALTH
12 SERVICES OR ALCOHOL AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES.

13 (D) “CRISIS SERVICES” MEANS TEMPORARY SERVICES DESIGNED TO
14 ADDRESS AND STABILIZE A SEVERE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROBLEM AND TO
15 AVOID AN EMERGENCY SITUATION, AND MAY INCLUDE HOTLINES, IN-HOME
16 SUPPORT, AND RESIDENTIAL CRISIS SERVICES.

17 (E) “MARYLAND DEFENSE FORCE” MEANS THE MILITARY FORCE
18 ESTABLISHED UNDER § 13-501 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.

19 (F) “MARYLAND NATIONAL GUARD” MEANS THE MARYLAND ARMY
20 NATIONAL GUARD AND MARYLAND AIR NATIONAL GUARD.

21 (G) “SERVICE COORDINATION” MEANS A SERVICE DESIGNED TO
22 COORDINATE AND PROVIDE ASSISTANCE IN OBTAINING ACCESS TO BEHAVIORAL
23 HEALTH SERVICES.

24 (H) “SERVICE COORDINATOR” MEANS A PERSON EMPLOYED BY THE
25 DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE SERVICE COORDINATION TO VETERANS.

26 (I) “UNIFORMED SERVICES” HAS THE MEANING STATED IN 10 U.S.C. §
27 101.

28 ~~(H)~~ (J) “VETERAN” MEANS A MARYLAND RESIDENT WHO:

29 (1) SERVED ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE ~~ARMED FORCES~~ UNIFORMED
30 SERVICES OF THE UNITED STATES, OTHER THAN FOR TRAINING, AND WAS

1 DISCHARGED OR RELEASED UNDER CONDITIONS OTHER THAN DISHONORABLE;

4 AS DEFINED IN FEDERAL REGULATIONS, ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 24, 2001, AND

6 SECRETARY OF DEFENSE; OR

7 (II) SERVED IN IRAQ OR CONTIGUOUS WATERS OR
8 AIRSPACE, AS DEFINED IN FEDERAL REGULATIONS, ON OR AFTER MARCH 19,
9 2003, AND BEFORE A TERMINAL DATE TO BE PRESCRIBED BY THE UNITED
10 STATES SECRETARY OF DEFENSE.

11 ~~(J)~~ (K) "WEB-BASED RESOURCE PROGRAM" MEANS AN INTERACTIVE
12 WEB-BASED COMMUNICATION MEDIUM THAT:

13 (1) ALLOWS INDIVIDUALS TO ACCESS COMPREHENSIVE
14 INFORMATION, ADVOCACY, AND OTHER RESOURCES REGARDING PUBLIC AND
15 PRIVATE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES, CRISIS AND EMERGENCY SERVICES,
16 AND EARLY INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION PROGRAMS; AND

17 (2) ENABLES THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HEALTH CARE

21 **STATE; AND**

22 **(II) SHORT-TERM BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES IN**
23 **RURAL AREAS OF THE STATE, WHERE EXISTING FEDERAL AND STATE**
24 **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES ARE DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO BE**
25 **INADEQUATE OR INACCESSIBLE.**

26 **(2) THE SHORT-TERM BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES PROVIDED**

28 **(I) SHALL BE AVAILABLE ONLY UNTIL A VETERAN IS ABLE**

5 **(3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEEK REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE**

7 **RESPONSIBLE PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PAYER FOR ANY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**
8 **SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.**

9 **(D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ACCOUNT SEPARATELY FOR FUNDS USED**
10 **TO PROVIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES TO VETERANS UNDER SUBSECTION**

13 **(A) THERE IS A VETERANS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADVISORY BOARD.**

14 **(B) THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING**
15 **MEMBERS:**

16 **(1) THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR;**

17 **(2) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY**
18 **THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;**

19 **(3) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY**
20 **THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;**

21 **(4) THE SECRETARY OF THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF**
22 **VETERANS AFFAIRS, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;**

23 **(5) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, OR THE**
24 **SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;**

25 **(6) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL, OR THE ADJUTANT GENERAL'S**
26 **DESIGNEE;**

27 **(7) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT**
28 **OF VETERANS AFFAIRS; AND**

29 ~~**(7)**~~ **(8) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE**
30 **GOVERNOR:**

1 (I) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A VETERANS SERVICE
2 ORGANIZATION;

4 DEPARTMENT;

5 (III) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A PRIVATE PROVIDER OF

9 (C) THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SHALL BE THE CHAIR OF THE

12 VETERANS AFFAIRS SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE ADVISORY BOARD.

13 (E) A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE
14 COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY BOARD, BUT IS ENTITLED TO
15 REIMBURSEMENT EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL
16 REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

17 (F) A MAJORITY OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE ADVISORY BOARD

22 (1) CONDUCT AN IMMEDIATE ANALYSIS OF THE BEHAVIORAL
23 HEALTH NEEDS OF VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES;

24 (2) IDENTIFY THE GAPS IN BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES
25 AVAILABLE TO VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES;

26 (3) IDENTIFY IMPEDIMENTS TO THE ABILITY OF VETERANS AND
27 THEIR FAMILIES TO ACCESS THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES THAT ARE
28 AVAILABLE, PARTICULARLY IN THE STATE'S RURAL AREAS;

1 (4) **FACILITATE COLLABORATION AMONG ORGANIZATIONS AND**

4 (5) **MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS WITH RESPECT TO IMPROVING**
5 **OUTREACH TO VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES IN NEED OF BEHAVIORAL**
6 **HEALTH SERVICES;**

7 (6) **PROMOTE FEDERAL AND STATE COLLABORATION TO**
8 **MAXIMIZE FUNDING AND ACCESS TO RESOURCES FOR THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**
9 **NEEDS OF VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES;**

10 (7) **MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS WITH RESPECT TO BUILDING**
11 **PROVIDER CAPACITY AND INCREASING PROVIDER TRAINING TO MEET THE**

16 (I) **THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT AN INTERIM REPORT OF ITS**
17 **FINDINGS ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2009, AND A FINAL REPORT OF ITS**
18 **FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2010, TO THE**
19 **GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE,**
20 **THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.**

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

22 (a) On or before September 1, 2008, the Department of Health and Mental
23 Hygiene, in conjunction with the Veterans Behavioral Health Advisory Board
24 established under Section 1 of this Act, shall submit a grant application to the United
25 States Department of Veterans Affairs or other appropriate federal agency for a
26 minimum of \$3,500,000 in federal funds in fiscal year 2010 and a minimum of
27 \$3,500,000 in federal funds in fiscal year 2011 to support the provision of behavioral
28 health services to veterans under this Act.

29 (b) The Department shall send a copy of the application required under this
30 section to the members of the Maryland Congressional Delegation and, in accordance
31 with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Budget and Taxation
32 Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and
33 the House Health and Government Operations Committee.

34 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
35 effect June 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
36 May 31, 2011, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
37 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
