Reorganization of State Government - Department of Information Technology

FOR the purpose of reorganizing State government by establishing a Department of Information Technology as a principal unit of the Executive Branch; providing for the qualifications, appointment, powers, duties, and salary of the Secretary of Information Technology; providing for the duties of the Department of Information Technology; specifying that the Department of Information Technology is responsible for administering the information technology functions of the Executive Branch of State government; transferring the information technology and telecommunications functions of the Executive Branch from the Department of Budget and Management to the Department of Information Technology; requiring the Secretary to provide a certain annual report on certain technology development projects to the Department of Legislative Services; transferring the Telecommunications Access of Maryland program from the Department of Budget and Management to the Department of Information Technology; requiring certain shopping facilities to acquire and install certain communications devices; providing that the Department of Information Technology is a primary procurement unit; repealing a certain requirement regarding the adoption of regulations; repealing certain provisions of law rendered inapplicable by provisions of this Act; abolishing the State Information Technology Board; defining certain terms; providing for the transfer of certain employees under certain circumstances; providing for appropriate transitional provisions relating to the continuity of certain departments, boards, commissions, committees, agencies, and other units; providing for the transfer of certain property, records, fixtures, appropriations,
