3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Baltimore City Board of School 4 Commissioners; providing for the appointment of certain members of the Board 5 by the Governor and by the Mayor of Baltimore City; providing for the election 6 of certain members of the Board; providing for the reimbursement of a 7 member's expenses under certain circumstances; specifying qualifications and 8 requirements for members of the Board; specifying the term of members; 9 providing for the removal of members of the Board under certain circumstances; specifying certain powers and duties of the Board; providing for the termination 10 11 of the term of certain members of the Board; and generally relating to the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners. 12

- 3 (f) At least [four] **ONE** of the **APPOINTED** voting members shall possess a 4 high level of knowledge and expertise concerning the successful administration of a 5 large business, nonprofit, or governmental entity and shall have served in a high level 6 management position within such an entity.
- 7 (g) At least [three] **ONE** of the **APPOINTED** voting members shall possess a high level of knowledge and expertise concerning education.
- 9 (h) At least one **OF THE APPOINTED** voting [member] **MEMBERS** shall be a parent of a student enrolled in the Baltimore City Public School System as of the date of appointment of the member.
- 12 (i) (1) Among the [nine] **FOUR APPOINTED** voting members, at least one 13 member shall also possess knowledge or experience in the education of children with disabilities.
- 15 (2) The knowledge or experience may be derived from being the parent 16 of a child with a disability.
- 17 (j) (1) The term of a voting member is [3] 4 years BEGINNING ON THE 18 FIRST MONDAY IN DECEMBER AFTER THE MEMBER'S ELECTION OR 19 APPOINTMENT AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED OR APPOINTED AND 20 QUALIFIES.
- 21 (2) [The terms of the voting members are staggered as required by the 22 terms provided for members of the Board on June 1, 1997.
- 23 (3)] At the end of a term, a voting member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- [(4)] (3) A voting member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the remainder of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 28 [(5)] **(4)** A voting member may not serve more than two consecutive 29 full terms.
- [(6)] (5) To the extent practicable, the Governor and the Mayor shall fill any vacancy on the Board within 60 days of the date of the vacancy from a list of qualified individuals submitted to the Mayor and the Governor by the State Board.



13 14 15	(ii) In a primary election to nominate board of education candidates, any registered voter of the county, regardless of party affiliation or lack of party affiliation, is eligible to vote in those contests for nomination.
16 17	(2) Candidates for election to boards of education shall, without party designation or regard to party affiliation:
