

- 1 (ii) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, 2 membership in the Employees' Pension System is optional for an individual under 3 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph until the individual ceases employment with the 4 participating governmental unit that was employing the individual on June 30, 2004.
- 5 (2) Membership in the Employees' Pension System is not optional for 6 individuals who are:
- 7 (i) supportive service employees of the Board of Education of 8 Kent County;
- 9 (ii) employees of the Town of Oakland; [or]
- 10 (iii) employees of the City of Frostburg; OR

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- 13 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and [§§ 31–111.1 and 31–111.3] §§ 31–111.1, 31–111.3, AND 31–111.4 of this subtitle, if an employee of a participating governmental unit joins the Employees' Pension System within 1 year after the effective date, the employee is entitled to service credit for employment with the participating governmental unit before the effective date.
 - (b) If an employee of the Baltimore Metropolitan Council elects to become a member of the Employees' Retirement System or the Employees' Pension System, the employee may not receive credit for service from July 1, 1992, to the effective date unless the employee pays to the Board of Trustees the amount of the member contributions the employee would have made during that period, plus regular interest.

- 24 (A) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWN OF BERWYN
 25 HEIGHTS ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE SHALL RECEIVE ELIGIBILITY SERVICE AND
 26 CREDITABLE SERVICE IN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM EQUAL TO
 27 ONE-THIRD OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERIOD OF EMPLOYMENT WITH THE TOWN OF
 28 BERWYN HEIGHTS BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE, AS CERTIFIED BY THE TOWN
 29 OF BERWYN HEIGHTS AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 30 (B) If AN EMPLOYEE OR FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWN OF BERWYN
 31 HEIGHTS BECOMES A MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM AT ANY
 32 TIME AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE, THE EMPLOYEE MAY NOT RECEIVE SERVICE
 33 CREDIT FOR EMPLOYMENT WITH THE TOWN OF BERWYN HEIGHTS BEFORE THE
 34 EFFECTIVE DATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
