A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Minor Holding Provisional Driver’s License – Passenger**
3 **Restrictions**

4 FOR the purpose of extending the period of time from the date a provisional driver’s
5 license is issued to a minor during which the minor is prohibited from
6 transporting certain individuals under a certain age as passengers except under
7 certain circumstances; and generally relating to passenger restrictions for a
8 minor holding a provisional driver’s license.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Transportation**

17 21-1123.

18 (a) (1) The provisions of this subsection do not apply if the holder of the
19 provisional driver’s license is driving while accompanied by and under the immediate
20 supervision of an individual who:

21 (i) Is at least 21 years old;

22 (ii) Has been licensed for at least 3 years in this State or in
23 another state to drive vehicles of the class then being driven by the holder of the
24 provisional driver’s license; and

1 (iii) Is seated beside the holder of the provisional driver's license.

(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, a holder of a provisional driver's license who is under the age of 18 years may not drive a motor vehicle with a passenger under the age of 18 years.

5 (3) The prohibition under paragraph (2) of this subsection:

6 (i) Shall be in effect from the date the provisional license is
7 originally issued until [the 151st day] **1 YEAR** after the provisional license was issued;
8 and

9 (ii) Does not apply to a passenger who is:

14 (b) A police officer may enforce this section only as a secondary action when
15 the police officer detains a driver for a suspected violation of another provision of the
16 Code.

17 (c) A violation of this section is a moving violation for the purposes of §
18 16-402 of this article.

19 (d) (1) If the Administration receives satisfactory evidence that an
20 individual has violated this section, the Administration may suspend or revoke the
21 individual's driver's license.

22 (2) An individual may request a hearing as provided for a suspension
23 or revocation under Title 16, Subtitle 2 of this article.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2008.
