14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 2 – Anne Arundel County

18 (A) By ordinance enacted by the County Council, and subject to any 19 applicable express prohibition in the Anne Arundel County Charter, the County may 20 fix, impose, and collect development impact fees for financing, in whole or in part, the 21 capital costs of additional or expanded public works, improvements, and facilities 22 required to accommodate new construction or development.

(B) (1) BY ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL, THE COUNTY MAY GRANT EXEMPTIONS FROM OR CREDITS AGAINST DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES FOR DEVELOPMENT BY NOT-FOR-PROFIT ENTITIES.
