Preamble

13 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland, under Article III of the 14 Maryland Constitution, is empowered to assemble to make new laws, as the common 15 good may require; and

16 WHEREAS, Article 24 of the Declaration of Rights of the Maryland 17 Constitution guarantees that no person may be deprived of life, liberty, or property, 18 without due process of law or denied the equal protection of the laws; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly, in the exercise of its constitutional powers and in carrying out its duties and responsibilities under the law, finds it necessary and proper to ensure that the rights of the citizens of the State extend to each newly born and unborn human person; now, therefore,

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
