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## **Education - Military Recruiters - Student Contact Information – Opportunity to Opt Out**

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring public schools to provide notice to certain students or the parents or guardians of the students about the right not to release student 5 6 contact information to military recruiters; requiring public schools to include 7 the notice in a certain format, size, and type on the card requesting emergency 8 contact information for the student; requesting the student or the parent or 9 guardian of the student to indicate whether the student's contact information is 10 to be released to military recruiters; requiring the principal of a school to submit to the county board of education a list of students whose names are not 11 submitted to military recruiters; and generally relating to the right not to 12 13 release student contact information to military recruiters.

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- (A) [Each] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, EACH public school under the jurisdiction of a county board that provides access to its buildings and grounds or its student information directory to any person or group which makes students aware of occupational or educational options shall provide access on the same basis to official recruiting representatives of the military forces of this State and the United States for the purpose of informing students of educational and career opportunities available in the military.
- 8 (B) (1) A PUBLIC SCHOOL SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION SHALL 9 PROVIDE NOTICE TO EACH STUDENT AND TO THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF 10 EACH STUDENT ENROLLED AT THE SCHOOL THAT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH 11 FEDERAL LAW, THE STUDENT OR THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE STUDENT 12 MAY REQUEST THAT THE STUDENT'S NAME, ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE 13 NUMBER NOT BE RELEASED TO MILITARY RECRUITERS.
  - (2) THE NOTICE DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL:
- 16 (I) BE INCLUDED IN A CLEAR AND CONSPICUOUS MANNER
  17 AND IN THE SAME SIZE TYPE AS THE OTHER STATEMENTS ON THE CARD
  18 REQUESTING EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION THAT IS DISTRIBUTED BY
  19 THE PUBLIC SCHOOL TO EACH STUDENT OR PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE
  20 STUDENT; AND
- 21REQUEST THAT THE STUDENT OR THE PARENT OR (II)22GUARDIAN OF THE STUDENT INDICATE WHETHER THE STUDENT'S NAME, 23ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE NUMBER IS TO BE RELEASED TO MILITARY 24 CHECKING **EITHER** THE BOX "RELEASE RECRUITERS BY **CONTACT** 25 INFORMATION" OR "DO NOT RELEASE CONTACT INFORMATION".
- 26 (3) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 AND MARCH 1 OF EACH SCHOOL
  27 YEAR, THE PRINCIPAL OF EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL IN A COUNTY SHALL SUBMIT A
  28 LIST TO THE COUNTY BOARD THAT INCLUDES THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND
  29 TELEPHONE NUMBER OF EACH STUDENT WHOSE CONTACT INFORMATION IS NOT
  30 RELEASED TO MILITARY RECRUITERS AS DIRECTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2)(II)
  31 OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 October 1, 2008.
