## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

3	FOR the purpose of altering the monthly rate of payment for foster care in a single

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (a) The Department shall adopt rules and regulations that establish
  eligibility guidelines for payment for foster care for 1 or more classes of children,
  including children who are in need of special care.
- (b) (1) [For a child who does not need special care] BEGINNING IN
  FISCAL YEAR 2010, the Department shall pay for foster care in a single family home
  at a monthly rate that is not less than [55% of the monthly rate provided in subsection
  (c) of this section for a child who requires the most demanding special care in a single
