1 AN ACT concerning

Public Schools - Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System - Passive Parental Consent

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to require local school systems to utilize passive parental consent before administering a certain survey; requiring local school systems to provide parents with certain statements and forms; requiring certain forms to be part of a certain card that
 requests certain information in certain years; and generally relating to the administration of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk

WHEREAS, Many factors contributing to crippling or fatal injuries, asthma,
obesity, and other health problems of children and youth are associated with
environmental or behavioral risk factors; and

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1 WHEREAS, Reliable data on risk factors contributing to child and adolescent 2 deaths and illnesses enable public health personnel to develop programs to mitigate 3 these factors; and

4 WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 5 have created the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS), which is a tool to 6 measure these factors and to monitor the effectiveness of risk reduction programs; and

7 WHEREAS, The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 8 recommend the use of passive consent for the administration of the YRBSS survey, in 9 order to obtain a completely representative and statistically valid number of survey 10 participants; now, therefore,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

14 7-420.

(a) The Department shall establish procedures for the administration of the
Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System
survey.

(b) The Department may omit up to a maximum of one-third of the survey
 questions if the Department considers the content of the questions inappropriate.

(c) (1) The Department shall require a local school system to [obtain
 parental consent using a parental consent form] UTILIZE PASSIVE PARENTAL
 CONSENT before administering the survey.

23 (2) The [parental consent form shall include] LOCAL SCHOOL
 24 SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE EACH PARENT WITH:

- 25**(I)** [a] A statement that explains: 261. **NOTIFIES THE PARENT THAT:** 27**A**. THE SURVEY IS CONFIDENTIAL; 28**B**. THE ANSWERS WILL BE KEPT PRIVATE; 29 **C**. THE STUDENT'S NAME WILL NOT BE REQUIRED ON 30 THE SURVEY RESPONSE SHEET; AND 31D. THE SURVEY IS DESIGNED TO IDENTIFY RISK
- 32 BEHAVIORS THAT MAY INCLUDE SAFETY BEHAVIORS SUCH AS USE OF HELMETS

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AND SEAT BELTS, DEPRESSION AND MENTAL HEALTH, USE OF TOBACCO, ALCOHOL, OR OTHER DRUGS, NUTRITION AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY, AND SEXUAL BEHAVIOR; AND

4 <u>2.</u> <u>EXPLAINS</u> how a parent can obtain a copy of the 5 survey questions that will be administered and more information regarding the 6 survey, including the mailing address, telephone number, and website address of the 7 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; AND

8 (II) A DENIAL OF PERMISSION FORM THAT MAY BE 9 RETURNED BY THE PARENT TO THE SCHOOL.

10(D)FOR THE YEAR DURING WHICH THE SURVEY WILL BE CONDUCTED,11THE DENIAL OF PERMISSION FORM SHALL BE A PART OF THE CARD REQUESTING12EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION THAT IS DISTRIBUTED BY THE PUBLIC13SCHOOL TO EACH STUDENT OR PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE STUDENT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2008.
