### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Lawyers – Payment of Taxes and Unemployment Insurance Contributions

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement that the Client Protection Fund verify 4 that a lawyer has paid or provided for payment of all undisputed taxes and unemployment insurance contributions before accepting a certain annual fee 5 6 from the lawyer; requiring the Fund to provide a certain list of lawyers to the 7 Comptroller; authorizing the Comptroller to take certain action if the 8 Comptroller determines that a lawyer has not paid certain taxes and 9 unemployment insurance contributions and the lawyer does not make payment 10 or provide for payment in a certain manner within a certain time after receiving notice from the Comptroller; and generally relating to verifying that certain 11 lawyers have paid or provided for payment of all undisputed taxes and 12 13 unemployment insurance contributions.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) By August 31 of each year, the Fund shall provide [to the Department of
Assessments and Taxation] a list of lawyers who have paid an annual fee to the Fund
during the previous fiscal year[,] TO:

5 (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF ASSESSMENTS AND TAXATION, to assist 6 the Department [of Assessments and Taxation] in identifying new businesses within 7 the State; AND

8 (2) THE COMPTROLLER, TO ASSIST THE COMPTROLLER IN 9 DETERMINING WHETHER EACH LAWYER ON THE LIST HAS PAID ALL 10 UNDISPUTED TAXES AND UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE CONTRIBUTIONS 11 PAYABLE TO THE COMPTROLLER OR THE SECRETARY OF LABOR, LICENSING, 12 AND REGULATION.

- 13 (b) The list provided under this section shall:
- 14 (1) be provided free of charge; and
- 15 (2) include, for each person on the list:
- 16

(i) the name and mailing address of the person; and

(ii) the federal tax identification number of the person or, if the
person does not have a federal tax identification number, the Social Security number
of the person.

20[Before any annual fee required under this part is accepted from a lawyer (c) 21and is deemed paid, the Fund shall verify through the office of the Comptroller that 22the lawyer has paid all undisputed taxes and unemployment insurance contributions 23payable to the Comptroller or the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation or 24that the lawyer has provided for payment in a manner satisfactory to the unit 25responsible for collection.] IF THE COMPTROLLER DETERMINES THAT A LAWYER 26HAS NOT PAID ALL UNDISPUTED TAXES AND UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE 27CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE TO THE COMPTROLLER OR THE SECRETARY OF 28LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION AND THE LAWYER DOES NOT MAKE 29 PAYMENT OR PROVIDE FOR PAYMENT IN A MANNER SATISFACTORY TO THE UNIT 30 **RESPONSIBLE FOR COLLECTION WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING NOTICE OF** 31THE DELINQUENCY FROM THE COMPTROLLER, OR WITHIN ANY LONGER PERIOD 32AUTHORIZED FOR GOOD CAUSE BY THE UNIT RESPONSIBLE FOR COLLECTION, 33 THE COMPTROLLER MAY REFER THE MATTER TO BAR COUNSEL UNDER 34MARYLAND RULE 16-731.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 June 1, 2008.
