# A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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### **Task Force to Study Offshore Wind Farms**

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Offshore Wind Farms; establishing the membership of the Task Force; providing for the designation of 4 5 a chair of the Task Force; providing for staff for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving compensation, but authorizing certain 6 7 reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain issues; requiring the Task Force to 8 9 report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and 10 generally relating to the Task Force to Study Offshore Wind Farms. 11

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1 (G) THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND  $\mathbf{2}$ **RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246** 3 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR **BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2010.** 4

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 7 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 8 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
