17 (a) (1) A person who leaves an unharmed newborn with a responsible 18 adult within [3] **10** days after the birth of the newborn, as determined within a 19 reasonable degree of medical certainty, and does not express an intent to return for 20 the newborn shall be immune from civil liability or criminal prosecution for the act.
