A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicles – Certificates of Title – Rebuilt Salvage

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a certificate of title to a vehicle contain a
4 conspicuous notation that the vehicle is “rebuilt salvage” whenever an
5 insurance company’s application for a salvage certificate for the vehicle contains
6 a statement that the cost to repair the vehicle for highway operation was equal
7 to or less than the fair market value of the vehicle prior to the vehicle
8 sustaining damage; and generally relating to salvaged vehicles.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23 (c) (1) An insurance company shall apply for a salvage certificate on a
24 form provided by the Administration for each vehicle titled in the State that is

1 acquired as a result of a claim settlement arising from an accident that occurred in the
2 State.

3 (2) The application under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be
4 accompanied by:

5 (i) The certificate of title of the vehicle;

6 (ii) A statement by the insurance company that:

7 1. The cost to repair the vehicle for highway operation is
8 greater than the fair market value of the vehicle prior to sustaining the damage for
9 which the claim was paid;

10 2. The cost to repair the vehicle for highway operation is
11 equal to or less than the fair market value of the vehicle prior to sustaining the
12 damage for which the claim was paid;

13 3. The vehicle is not rebuildable, will be used for parts
14 only, and is not to be retitled; or

15 4. The vehicle has been stolen; and

16 (iii) A fee established by the Administration.

17 (3) Subject to the provisions of § 13–507(c)(2) of this subtitle, a salvage
18 certificate issued under this paragraph shall contain a conspicuous notation by the
19 Administration that describes which of the statements under paragraph (2)(ii) of this
20 subsection applies to the vehicle.

22 (a) (1) An application for a certificate of title of a vehicle for which a
23 salvage certificate has been issued shall be made by the owner of the vehicle on a form
24 that the Administration requires.

25 (2) An application under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be
26 accompanied by:

27 (i) Except as provided in subsection (c)(3) of this section, the
28 salvage certificate for the vehicle;

29 (ii) A certificate of inspection issued by a county police
30 department or the Department of State Police; and

31 (iii) A certificate of inspection as required under Title 23 of this
32 article.

(3) (i) The Administration may establish a fee for an inspection under paragraph (2)(ii) of this subsection.

8 (b) (1) The certificate of title issued by the Administration shall be:

9 (i) Issued in the name of the applicant; and

10 (ii) In a form as provided in this subsection.

14 (i) Bears a notation under § 13-506(c)(2)(ii)1 **OR 2** of this
15 subtitle; or

16 (ii) [Does not bear a notation under § 13-506(c)(2)(ii)2 of this
17 subtitle] **WAS ISSUED BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 1992, AND THE APPLICATION IS**
18 **ACCOMPANIED BY A STATEMENT IN WRITING FROM THE INSURANCE COMPANY**
19 **THAT THE COST TO REPAIR THE VEHICLE WAS EQUAL TO OR LESS THAN THE**
20 **FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE VEHICLE PRIOR TO THE VEHICLE SUSTAINING**
21 **DAMAGE.**

22 (3) The Administration shall issue a certificate of title that does not
23 contain a notation under paragraph (2) of this subsection if the salvage certificate
24 accompanying the application[:

25 (i) Bears a notation under § 13–506(c)(2)(ii)2 of this subtitle;

(iii) Is] IS issued for a vehicle that is more than 7 model years old.

32 (c) (1) When an insurance company makes a claim settlement on a
33 vehicle that has been stolen, the company shall apply for a salvage certificate as
34 provided in § 13–506(c) of this subtitle.

1 (2) On receipt of an application under this subsection, the
2 Administration:

3 (i) Shall make the appropriate notation in its records; and

4 (ii) May not issue the salvage certificate until the vehicle is
5 recovered.

6 (3) When a vehicle that has been stolen is recovered, the
7 Administration shall:

(i) Issue a salvage certificate for the vehicle if the insurance company submits a certification under § 13–506(c)(2)(ii)1, 2, or 3 of this subtitle; or

10 (ii) Issue a certificate of title in lieu of a salvage certificate if the
11 insurance company states that the vehicle has not sustained damage or has sustained
12 only minor damage.

13 (4) The provisions of subsection (b) of this section apply to a certificate
14 of title issued under this subsection.

15 (5) A vehicle for which a certificate of title was issued under
16 paragraph (3)(ii) of this subsection is exempt from the vehicle excise tax as provided in
17 § 13–810(a)(9) of this title.

18 (d) If the Administration receives an application for a certificate of title for a
19 vehicle accompanied by an ownership document issued by another state containing a
20 notation under the laws of the issuing state that the vehicle is in a condition that is
21 substantially similar to a vehicle that is rebuilt salvage under Maryland law, the
22 certificate of title issued by the Administration shall contain a similar notation.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
24 October 1, 2008.
