## 2 Immunity from Liability - Medical Emergency - Use of Automated External Defibrillator

- 4 FOR the purpose of providing immunity from civil liability under certain 5 circumstances, notwithstanding certain other provisions of law, to an individual 6 or facility that acquires an automated external defibrillator (AED) or that owns. 7 manages, or is responsible for the premises where an AED is located, to a 8 certain individual who retrieves an AED, or to a certain individual who uses, 9 attempts to use, or fails to use an AED in response to a sudden cardiac arrest 10 emergency at a facility; altering, under the Automated External Defibrillation Program of the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems, 11 altering the circumstances under which an individual is immune from civil 12 13 liability for providing automated external defibrillation; providing that immunity from liability is not available to certain persons individuals for 14 15 certain conduct that is grossly negligent, willful or wanton misconduct, or 16 intentionally tortious conduct; and generally relating to immunity from liability 17 for use of an automated external defibrillator.
