A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Procurement - Preference Procurement Program for Sheltered Workshops Individual With Disability Owned Businesses

4 FOR the purpose of expanding eligibility in the preference procurement program for 5 sheltered workshops within the Department of General Services to include a 6 specified entity; defining the entity and specifying requirements for the entity to 7 qualify to participate in the program; requiring a specified committee to establish and review specified eligibility guidelines for participation in the 8 9 program; requiring the committee to maintain and periodically review and 10 revise a specified list of entities eligible for the program; and generally relating 11 to the preference procurement program for sheltered workshops and individual with disability owned businesses. 12

The Secretary of General Services shall designate Maryland Works, Inc., or another appropriate coordinating entity, to facilitate the distribution of procurement contracts for supplies and services among sheltered workshops **AND INDIVIDUAL WITH DISABILITY OWNED BUSINESSES**.
