1 AN ACT concerning

2 Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Convention Center License

FOR the purpose of establishing a Class B-CC (convention center) beer, wine and 3 liquor license in Prince George's County; specifying that a license may be issued 4 only to a certain establishment that is equipped with certain rooms and 5 6 facilities; providing for an annual license fee; requiring that the total average 7 daily receipts from certain sources exceed the average daily receipts from the 8 sale of alcoholic beverages; specifying certain hours of sale; authorizing the sale 9 of alcoholic beverages from locked, prestocked private bars under certain circumstances; authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages and dancing and live 10 entertainment throughout the licensed establishment; specifying that this Act 11 does not preclude a license holder from having an interest in certain other 12 licenses; providing for certain exceptions to certain licensing restrictions; 13 making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Class 14 15 B–CC (convention center) alcoholic beverages license in Prince George's County.

- 2. THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ESTABLISHMENT SHALL REMOVE THE BAR KEY FROM ANY ROOM THAT IS RENTED TO A GUEST UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS.
- 9 (VII) ALCOHOLIC MAY \mathbf{BE} SOLD **BEVERAGES FOR** 10 **CONSUMPTION** ON THE **PREMISES** THROUGHOUT THE LICENSED 11 ESTABLISHMENT, BOTH INDOORS AND OUTDOORS, INCLUDING MEETING AND 12 BANQUET ROOMS, PATIOS, VERANDAS, QUAYS, AND GREEN SPACES.
