A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

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Correctional Officers' Retirement System - Membership - Parole and Probation

4 FOR the purpose of providing certain individuals who are employed by the Division of 5 Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional 6 Services with membership in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; 7 requiring the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System to 8 transfer certain contributions to certain funds of the Correctional Officers' 9 Retirement System; requiring certain individuals who are employed by the 10 Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to have a certain number of years of eligibility service to 11 receive a normal service retirement allowance from the Correctional Officers' 12 Retirement System; providing that certain provisions of law do not apply to 13 14 certain transfers between the employees' systems and the Correctional Officers' 15 Retirement System; and generally relating to transferring certain individuals who are employed by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of 16 17 Public Safety and Correctional Services into the Correctional Officers' 18 Retirement System.
