### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Vehicle Laws - Prohibition Against Minors with Provisional License Transporting Minors - Enforcement

FOR the purpose of repealing a provision of law that limits a police officer to enforcing
a certain prohibition, only as a secondary action, against a holder of a
provisional driver's license who is a minor transporting certain other minors
when the police officer detains the driver on suspicion of violating another
provision of law; and generally relating to the enforcement of laws prohibiting
the transportation of minors by minors who hold provisional drivers' licenses.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) (1) The provisions of this subsection do not apply if the holder of the
 provisional driver's license is driving while accompanied by and under the immediate
 supervision of an individual who:

(i) Is at least 21 years old;

4	(iii) Is seated beside the holder of the provisional driver's license.
5 6 7	(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, a holder of a provisional driver's license who is under the age of 18 years may not drive a motor vehicle with a passenger under the age of 18 years.
8	(3) The prohibition under paragraph (2) of this subsection:
9 10	(i) Shall be in effect from the date the provisional license is originally issued until the 151st day after the provisional license was issued; and
11	(ii) Does not apply to a passenger who is:
