A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Compensation Program for Family Member Caretakers

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Compensation Program for Family Member 4 Caretakers in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for the 5 purpose of the Program; providing for eligibility for the Program; providing that 6 the Program shall provide certain compensation and health insurance benefits 7 to certain eligible individuals, subject to the limitations of the State budget; 8 providing that the Department may determine whether to provide health 9 insurance benefits to certain individuals based on certain criteria; requiring the 10 Department to determine what level of compensation to provide to certain individuals based on certain criteria; authorizing the Department to adopt 11 regulations to implement the Program; requiring the Department to submit a 12 certain report to the Governor and to the General Assembly on or before a 13 14 certain date each year; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 15 compensation for family member caretakers.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 25 Subtitle 27. Compensation Program for Family Member Caretakers.

- 1 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE COMPENSATION 2 PROGRAM FOR FAMILY MEMBER CARETAKERS.
- 3 (B) THERE IS A COMPENSATION PROGRAM FOR FAMILY MEMBER 4 CARETAKERS IN THE DEPARTMENT.
- 5 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION
 6 AND HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE UNABLE TO
 7 WORK OUTSIDE THE HOME DUE TO THE HEALTH NEEDS OF AN IMMEDIATE
 8 FAMILY MEMBER.

- 10 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PERSONAL CARE" MEANS SERVICES THAT AN INDIVIDUAL NORMALLY WOULD PERFORM PERSONALLY, BUT FOR WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL NEEDS HELP FROM ANOTHER DUE TO INFIRMITY OR PHYSICAL OR
- 13 MENTAL LIMITATION.
- 14 (B) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM IF 15 THE INDIVIDUAL:
- 16 (I) HAS BEEN OUT OF WORK FOR 5 OR MORE YEARS
 17 BECAUSE THE INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN PROVIDING DAILY PERSONAL CARE TO A
 18 MEMBER OF THE IMMEDIATE FAMILY OF THE INDIVIDUAL; AND
- 19 (II) MEETS ANY OTHER REASONABLE AND APPROPRIATE 20 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 21 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE SEVERITY
 22 OF THE IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBER'S INFIRMITY OR LIMITATION AND THE
 23 LEVEL OF CARE PROVIDED TO THE FAMILY MEMBER BY THE INDIVIDUAL IN
 24 DETERMINING WHETHER AN INDIVIDUAL IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM.
- 25 (C) SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THE STATE BUDGET, THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE COMPENSATION AND HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM.
- 28 (D) THE DEPARTMENT MAY DETERMINE WHETHER AN ELIGIBLE 29 INDIVIDUAL SHOULD RECEIVE HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS UNDER THE 30 PROGRAM BASED ON:
- 31 (1) Whether the eligible individual has health 32 insurance benefits; or

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- 5 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CALCULATE THE LEVEL OF 6 COMPENSATION THAT AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL MAY RECEIVE ON A SLIDING 7 SCALE, BASED ON THE INCOME AND ASSETS OF THE ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL AND 8 ANY OTHER CRITERIA THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS APPROPRIATE.

- 10 (A) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE 11 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 12 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN
 13 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE
 14 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR ON THE
 15 RESULTS OF THE PROGRAM.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
