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Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and Social Services by State
Agencies

- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and Social Services by State Agencies; providing for the membership and duties of 5 6 the Task Force; providing for the designation of a chair of the Task Force; 7 authorizing the Task Force to establish certain subcommittees; requiring the 8 Department of Budget and Management and the Department of General 9 Services to provide staff for the Task Force; prohibiting members of the Task 10 Force from receiving compensation; authorizing a member to receive certain reimbursement; requiring the Task Force to report certain findings and 11 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 12 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to 13 14 a Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and Social Services by State 15 Agencies.
- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That:
- 18 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and Social 19 Services by State Agencies.
 - (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 21 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the 22 President of the Senate;
- 23 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker 24 of the House;

The Task Force shall:

- 3 (2) examine and make recommendations regarding State agencies' 4 timeliness in preparing and issuing requests for proposals for the delivery of health 5 and human services;
- 6 (3) examine and make recommendations regarding the timeliness of payments to contractors;
- 8 (4) examine and make recommendations regarding possible 9 standardization of contracting processes among and within State agencies, including 10 standardization of related documents and documentation required of contractors; and
- 11 (5) identify and make recommendations regarding any other issues, 12 including current State laws or regulations affecting the efficiency and cost of 13 procuring health and social services.
- 14 (h) In evaluating processes and formulating recommendations, the Task 15 Force shall especially consider:
- 16 (1) the effect of procurement processes on quality and continuity of services;
- 18 (2) the costs and benefits of existing procurement procedures; and
- 19 (3) the effects of procurement requirements on the number and 20 diversity of potential providers of services contracted by the State.
- 21 (i) The Task Force shall report its preliminary findings and 22 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 23 Government Article, the General Assembly on or before November 30, 2008.
- 24 (j) The Task Force shall report its final findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before November 30, 2009.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2008. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
