- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and 5 Social Services by State Agencies; providing for the membership and duties of 6 the Task Force; providing for the designation of a chair of the Task Force; 7 authorizing the Task Force to establish certain subcommittees; requiring the 8 Department of Budget and Management and the Department of General 9 Services to provide staff for the Task Force; prohibiting members of the Task 10 Force from receiving compensation; authorizing a member to receive certain reimbursement; requiring the Task Force to report certain findings and 11 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 12 13 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a Task Force to Study the Procurement of Health and Social Services by State 14 15 Agencies.
