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Insurance Producers – Life and Health Insurance Examinations – Annual Reports

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner or a designee of the Commissioner on or before a certain date each year to prepare and publish a 5 6 certain report that relates to life and health insurance producer examinations 7 administered during a certain period of time; requiring the report to include 8 certain information about certain examinees in a certain manner; requiring the 9 Commissioner or a designee of the Commissioner on or before a certain date each year to prepare and make available on request a certain report that relates 10 to a certain test form used for certain examinations administered during a 11 certain period of time; requiring the report to show certain information about 12 certain test forms for certain examinees in a certain manner; and generally 13 14 relating to examinations for insurance producers.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 10–109.
- 24 (a) An individual applicant who otherwise qualifies for a license for life 25 insurance, health insurance, annuities, nonprofit health service plans, dental plan



- 1 organizations, or health maintenance organizations is entitled to be examined as $\mathbf{2}$ provided in this section. 3 (b) Each individual applicant must pass a personal written **(1)** 4 examination to determine: 5 (i) the competence of the applicant as to life insurance, health insurance, or annuities or to any subdivision of them, including contracts for nonprofit 6 health service plans, vision plans, dental plan organizations, and health maintenance 7 8 organizations; and 9 the familiarity of the applicant with the applicable laws of (ii) 10 the State. 11 (2)Each examination must be graded within 30 days after the date of 12 the examination. 13 An individual applicant who fails an examination may not take another examination until at least 14 days after the date of the last examination that the 14 applicant failed. 15 16 (d) The Commissioner shall adopt reasonable regulations that specify: 17 (1) the scope, type, conduct, and grading of the written examinations; 18 (2)the frequency, times, and places in the State where the written examinations will be held; and 19 20 subject to § 10–105(e) of this subtitle, the educational requirements 21 for an individual applicant to be eligible to take a written examination. 22 (E)**(1)** ON OR BEFORE APRIL 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSIONER 23OR A DESIGNEE OF THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PREPARE AND PUBLISH A 24 REPORT THAT SUMMARIZES STATISTICAL INFORMATION THAT RELATES TO THE 25 LIFE AND HEALTH INSURANCE PRODUCER EXAMINATIONS ADMINISTERED 26 DURING THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR. 27 **(2)** THE REPORT SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION 28 FOR ALL EXAMINEES COMBINED AND SEPARATELY BY RACE OR ETHNICITY, 29 GENDER, RACE OR ETHNICITY WITHIN GENDER, EDUCATIONAL LEVEL, AND 30 NATIVE LANGUAGE:
- 31 (I) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EXAMINEES;
- 32 (II) THE PERCENTAGE AND NUMBER OF EXAMINEES WHO 33 PASSED THE EXAMINATION;

1	(III) THE MEAN SCALED SCORES ON THE EXAMINATION; AND
2	(IV) THE STANDARD DEVIATION OF SCALED SCORES ON THE
3	EXAMINATION.
4	(F) (1) ON OR BEFORE APRIL 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSIONER
5	OR A DESIGNEE OF THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PREPARE AND MAKE AVAILABLE
6	ON REQUEST A REPORT THAT SUMMARIZES STATISTICAL INFORMATION THAT
7	RELATES TO EACH LIFE AND HEALTH INSURANCE PRODUCER TEST FORM USED
8	FOR EXAMINATIONS ADMINISTERED DURING THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR.
9	(2) THE REPORT SHALL SHOW, FOR EACH TEST FORM, FOR ALL
10	EXAMINEES COMBINED AND SEPARATELY FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN EXAMINEES
11	WHITE EXAMINEES, AMERICAN INDIAN EXAMINEES, ASIAN EXAMINEES,
12	HISPANIC EXAMINEES, AND OTHER EXAMINEES, THE CORRECT ANSWER RATES
13	AND CORRELATIONS.
14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15	October 1, 2008.
