1 AN ACT concerning

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Commission on Land Use at the Rosewood Center

FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission on Land Use at the Rosewood Center; 3 establishing the membership of the Commission; specifying the co-chairs of the 4 Commission; providing for the staffing of the Commission; prohibiting members 5 6 from receiving compensation or a certain expense reimbursement for service on 7 the Commission; requiring the Commission to review, discuss, and analyze 8 options for the use of the land and buildings at Rosewood Center once it closes 9 and develop a certain master plan; requiring the Commission to make certain reports to the Governor and the General Assembly by certain dates; providing 10 for the termination of this Act; prohibiting the transfer or disposition of 11 buildings or land associated with the Rosewood Center until after a certain 12 report is submitted to the Governor and the General Assembly; and generally 13 relating to the establishment of the Commission on Land Use at the Rosewood 14 Center. 15

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Preamble

WHEREAS, The Rosewood Center was established in 1888 as the "Asylum and
Training Center for the Feeble Minded" and has operated as a State mental health
facility for over 120 years in the picturesque Owings Mills area of Baltimore County;
and

21 WHEREAS, At its inception the Rosewood Center encompassed a 683–acre 22 campus and at its peak consisted of 43 buildings totaling 730,000 square feet, and still

1 today comprises 300 acres and 26 buildings in active use totaling 480,000 square feet; 2 and

3 WHEREAS, Many of the buildings currently in use at the Rosewood Center date 4 to the 1950s and 1960s, but at least one dates back to 1895; and

5 WHEREAS, On January 15, 2008, Governor O'Malley issued an Executive 6 Order to close Rosewood Center and relocate its residents over an 18-month period, 7 with most residents transitioning to community placements that provide the 8 appropriate services and setting; and

9 WHEREAS, Although at one time Rosewood was home to nearly 3,000 10 individuals, it is currently licensed to serve a total of 225 residents and on January 15, 11 2008, had 156 individuals in residence; and

12 WHEREAS, Over the years a substantial portion of the original acreage of the 13 Rosewood Center property has been transferred through the State surplus property 14 disposition process for use as a veterans' cemetery, a nature center, and for 15 school-related purposes; and

16 WHEREAS, The Governor has expressed a strong commitment to work with 17 Baltimore County officials and community residents to plan for the future use of the 18 remaining Rosewood Center property; and

19 WHEREAS, Baltimore County officials and residents in the community are 20 keenly interested in the future uses of the Rosewood Center property and strongly 21 desire to partner with State officials to chart potential appropriate public uses for the 22 property, including possible use as open space and parkland; now, therefore,

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That:

25 (a) There is a Commission on Land Use at the Rosewood Center.
