## Vehicle Laws - Failure to Yield Right-of-Way - Penalties for Death or Serious Bodily Injury

4 FOR the purpose of establishing that if a person fails to yield the right-of-way in 5 violation of certain provisions of law and the violation contributes to an accident 6 that results in the death or serious bodily injury of another, the person is 7 subject to a certain fine and the Motor Vehicle Administration is authorized to 8 suspend the person's license for a certain period of time; providing that a 9 licensee may request a hearing on a license suspension imposed under this Act; and generally relating to penalties for a failure to yield the right-of-way that 10 contributes to an accident that results in death or serious bodily injury. 11
