A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Alcoholic Beverages – Home Brewing Instructor’s Permit**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a home brewing instructor’s permit; providing a
4 permit fee; authorizing the Office of the Comptroller to issue a permit to certain
5 individuals; authorizing a permit holder to teach a client methods of brewing
6 beer under certain circumstances; restricting the use of beer produced for
7 certain purposes; prohibiting a permit holder from holding a certain license or
8 other permit; authorizing the Office of the Comptroller to adopt certain
9 regulations; and generally relating to a home brewing instructor’s permit.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

23 2–101.

24 (b) (1) (i) The Office of the Comptroller shall collect a fee for the
25 issuance or renewal of the following permits:

1 1. \$50 for a solicitor's permit, an individual storage
2 permit, a nonresident winery permit, or a commercial nonbeverage permit;

3 2. \$75 for a public storage permit, a public
4 transportation permit, or an import and export permit;

5 3. \$100 for a public storage and transportation permit, a
6 nonresident dealer permit, or a bulk transfer permit;

7 4. \$400 for a family beer and wine facility permit; [and]

8 5. \$10 for a direct wine seller's permit; AND

9 6. **\$250 FOR A HOME BREWING INSTRUCTOR'S**
10 **PERMIT.**

11 **(S-1) (1) THE OFFICE OF THE COMPTROLLER MAY ISSUE A HOME**
12 **BREWING INSTRUCTOR'S PERMIT TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS**
13 **OLD.**

14 **(2) THE PERMIT HOLDER MAY TEACH A CLIENT WHO IS AT LEAST**
15 **21 YEARS OLD METHODS OF HOME BREWING OF BEER:**

16 **(I) IN THE CLIENT'S HOME; AND**

17 **(II) WITH EQUIPMENT AND INGREDIENTS SUPPLIED BY THE**
18 **PERMIT HOLDER OR THE CLIENT.**

19 **(3) ALL BEER PRODUCED MAY BE USED ONLY FOR**
20 **INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES, HOME CONSUMPTION, AND THE PERSONAL USE OF**
21 **THE CLIENT.**

22 **(4) THE PERMIT HOLDER MAY NOT SIMULTANEOUSLY HOLD ANY**
23 **LICENSE OR OTHER PERMIT UNDER THIS ARTICLE.**

24 **(5) THE OFFICE OF THE COMPTROLLER MAY ADOPT**
25 **REGULATIONS REGARDING LIMITS ON THE QUANTITIES OF BEER PRODUCED,**
26 **REQUIREMENTS FOR RECORD KEEPING, AND ANY OTHER ACTIVITIES THAT**
27 **RELATE TO THE USE OF A HOME BREWING INSTRUCTOR'S PERMIT.**

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
29 June 1, 2008.
