## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Calvert County - Public Facilities Bonds**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing and empowering the County Commissioners of 4 Calvert County, from time to time, to borrow not more than \$8,895,000 to finance the construction, improvement, or development of certain public  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 facilities in Calvert County, as herein defined, and to effect such borrowing by 7 the issuance and sale at public or private sale of its general obligation bonds in 8 like par amount; empowering the County to fix and determine, by resolution, 9 the form, tenor, interest rate or rates or method of determining the same, terms, 10 conditions, maturities, and all other details incident to the issuance and sale of the bonds; empowering the County to issue refunding bonds for the purchase or 11 12 redemption of bonds in advance of maturity; empowering and directing the 13 County to levy, impose, and collect, annually, ad valorem taxes in rate and amount sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the maturing principal of 14 15and interest on the bonds; exempting the bonds and refunding bonds and the 16 interest thereon and any income derived therefrom from all State, county, 17municipal, and other taxation in the State of Maryland; providing that nothing in this Act shall prevent the County from authorizing the issuance and sale of 18 19 bonds the interest on which is not excludable from gross income for federal 20 income tax purposes; and generally relating to the issuance and sale of such bonds. 21

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23 MARYLAND, That, as used herein, the term "County" means the body politic and 24 corporate of the State of Maryland known as the County Commissioners of Calvert 25 County, and the term "construction, improvement, or development of public facilities"

1 means the acquisition, alteration, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, 2 equipping, expansion, extension, improvement, rehabilitation, renovation, upgrading, 3 and repair of public buildings and facilities, and issuance costs together with the costs 4 of acquiring land or interests in land as well as any related architectural, financial, 5 legal, planning, or engineering services.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County is hereby  $\mathbf{7}$ authorized to finance any part or all of the costs of the public facilities described in 8 Section 1 of this Act, and to borrow money and incur indebtedness for that purpose, at 9 one time or from time to time, in an amount not exceeding, in the aggregate, \$8,895,000 and to evidence such borrowing by the issuance and sale upon its full faith 10 and credit of general obligation bonds in like par amount, which may be issued at one 11 time or from time to time, in one or more groups or series, as the County may 1213 determine.

14 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the bonds shall be issued 15in accordance with a resolution of the County, which shall describe generally the 16 construction, improvement, or development of public facilities for which the proceeds 17 of the bond sale are intended and the amount needed for those purposes. The County shall have and is hereby granted full and complete authority and discretion in the 18 19 resolution to fix and determine with respect to the bonds of any issue: the designation, 20 date of issue, denomination or denominations, form or forms, and tenor of the bonds 21which, without limitation, may be issued in registered form within the meaning of 22Section 30 of Article 31 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended; the rate or 23rates of interest payable thereon, or the method of determining the same, which may 24include a variable rate; the date or dates and amount or amounts of maturity, which 25need not be in equal par amounts or in consecutive annual installments, provided only 26 that no bond of any issue shall mature later than 30 years from the date of its issue; 27the manner of selling the bonds, which may be at either public or private sale, for such 28 price or prices as may be determined to be for the best interests of Calvert County; the 29 manner of executing and sealing the bonds, which may be by facsimile; the terms and 30 conditions, if any, under which bonds may be tendered for payment or purchase prior 31to their stated maturity; the terms or conditions, if any, under which bonds may or 32shall be redeemed prior to their stated maturity; the place or places of payment of the 33 principal of and the interest on the bonds, which may be at any bank or trust company 34within or without the State of Maryland; covenants relating to compliance with 35 applicable requirements of federal income tax law, including (without limitation) 36 covenants regarding the payment of rebate or penalties in lieu of rebate; covenants 37 relating to compliance with applicable requirements of federal or state securities laws: 38and generally all matters incident to the terms, conditions, issuance, sale, and delivery 39 thereof.

The bonds may be made redeemable before maturity, at the option of the County, at such price or prices and under such terms and conditions as may be fixed by the County prior to the issuance of the bonds, either in the resolution or in a bond order pursuant to the bond resolution. The bonds may be issued in registered form and provision may be made for the registration of the principal only. In case any officer whose signature appears on any bond ceases to be such officer before the delivery

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thereof, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes as if he had remained in office until such delivery. The bonds and the issuance and sale thereof shall be exempt from the provisions of Sections 9, 10, and 11 of Article 31 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended.

 $\mathbf{5}$ The County may enter into agreements with agents, banks, fiduciaries, 6 insurers, or others for the purpose of enhancing the marketability of any security for  $\mathbf{7}$ the bonds and for the purpose of securing any tender option that may be granted to 8 holders of the bonds, all as may be determined and presented in the aforesaid 9 resolution, which may (but need not) state as security for the performance by the 10 County of any monetary obligations under such agreements the same security given by 11 the County to bondholders for the performance by the County of its monetary 12obligations under the bonds.

13 If the County determines in the resolution to offer any of the bonds by 14 solicitation of competitive bids at public sale, the resolution shall fix the terms and 15conditions of the public sale and shall adopt a form of notice of sale, which shall 16 outline the terms and conditions, and a form of advertisement, which shall be 17published in one or more daily or weekly newspapers having a general circulation in the County and which may also be published in one or more journals having a 18 19 circulation primarily among banks and investment bankers. At least one publication of 20 the advertisement shall be made not less than 10 days before the sale of the bonds.

Upon delivery of any bonds to the purchaser or purchasers, payment therefor shall be made to the Treasurer of Calvert County or such other official of Calvert County as may be designated to receive such payment in a resolution passed by the County before such delivery.

25SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net proceeds of the 26 sale of bonds shall be used and applied exclusively and solely for the acquisition, 27construction, improvement, or development of public facilities for which the bonds are 28sold. If the amounts borrowed shall prove inadequate to finance the projects described 29 in the resolution, the County may issue additional bonds with the limitations hereof 30 for the purpose of evidencing the borrowing of additional funds for such financing, 31 provided the resolution authorizing the sale of additional bonds shall so recite, but if 32the net proceeds of the sale of any issue of bonds exceed the amount needed to finance the projects described in the resolution, the excess funds so borrowed and not 33 34expended shall be applied to the payment of the next principal maturity of the bonds or to the redemption of any part of the bonds which have been made redeemable or to 35 36 the purchase and cancellation of bonds, unless the County shall adopt a resolution allocating the excess funds to the acquisition, construction, improvement, or 37 38 development of other public facilities, as defined and within the limits set forth in this 39 Act.

40 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the bonds hereby 41 authorized shall constitute, and they shall so recite, an irrevocable pledge of the full 42 faith and credit and unlimited taxing power of the County to the payment of the 43 maturing principal of and interest on the bonds as and when they become payable. In

each and every fiscal year that any of the bonds are outstanding, the County shall levy 1  $\mathbf{2}$ or cause to be levied ad valorem taxes upon all the assessable property within the 3 corporate limits of the County in rate and amount sufficient to provide for or assure 4 the payment, when due, of the principal of and interest on all the bonds maturing in each such fiscal year and, in the event the proceeds from the taxes so levied in any  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 such fiscal year shall prove inadequate for such payment, additional taxes shall be 7 levied in the succeeding fiscal year to make up any such deficiency. The County may 8 apply to the payment of the principal of and interest on any bonds issued hereunder 9 any funds received by it from the State of Maryland, the United States of America, any 10 agency or instrumentality thereof, or from any other source, if such funds are granted for the purpose of assisting the County in financing the acquisition, construction, 11 improvement, or development of the public facilities defined in this Act and, to the 1213extent of any such funds received or receivable in any fiscal year, the taxes that are 14 required to be levied may be reduced accordingly.

15SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County is further 16 authorized and empowered, at any time and from time to time, to issue its bonds in 17the manner hereinabove described for the purpose of refunding, by payment at 18 maturity or upon purchase or redemption, any bonds issued hereunder. The validity of 19 any such refunding bonds shall in no way be dependent upon or related to the validity 20or invalidity of the obligations so refunded. The powers herein granted with respect to 21the issuance of bonds shall be applicable to the issuance of refunding bonds. Such 22refunding bonds may be issued by the County in such an amount as shall be necessary 23for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay any of its outstanding bonds issued 24hereunder at maturity, for the purpose of providing it with funds to purchase in the 25open market any of its outstanding bonds issued hereunder, prior to the maturity 26thereof, or for the purpose of providing it with funds for the redemption prior to 27maturity of any outstanding bonds issued hereunder which are, by their terms, 28redeemable, for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay interest on any 29 outstanding bonds issued hereunder prior to their payment at maturity of purchase or 30 redemption in advance of maturity, or for the purpose of providing it with funds to pay 31any redemption or purchase premium in connection with the refunding of any of its 32outstanding bonds issued hereunder. The proceeds of the sale of any such refunding 33 bonds shall be segregated and set apart by the County as a separate trust fund to be 34used solely for the purpose of paying the purchase or redemption prices of the bonds to 35 be refunded.

36 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the County may, prior to the preparation of definitive bonds, issue interim certificates or temporary bonds. 37 38exchangeable for definitive bonds when such bonds have been executed and are 39 available for such delivery, provided, however, that any such interim certificates or 40 temporary bonds shall be issued in all respects subject to the restrictions and 41 requirements set forth in this Act. The County may, by appropriate resolution, provide 42for the replacement of any bonds issued hereunder which shall have become mutilated or lost or destroyed upon such conditions and after receiving such indemnity as the 4344 County may require.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any and all obligations 1  $\mathbf{2}$ issued pursuant to the authority of this Act, their transfer, the interest payable 3 thereon, and any income derived therefrom in the hands of the holders thereof from 4 time to time (including any profit made in the sale thereof) shall be and are hereby  $\mathbf{5}$ declared to be at all times exempt from State, county, municipal, or other taxation of 6 every kind and nature whatsoever within the State of Maryland. Nothing in this Act  $\mathbf{7}$ shall prevent the County from authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds the interest 8 on which is not excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

9 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the authority to borrow 10 money and issue bonds conferred on the County by this Act shall be deemed to provide an additional and alternative authority for borrowing money and shall be regarded as 11 12supplemental and additional to powers conferred upon the County by other laws and shall not be regarded as in derogation of any power now existing; and all Acts of the 13 14 General Assembly of Maryland heretofore passed authorizing the County to borrow 15money are hereby continued to the extent that the powers contained in such Acts have 16 not been exercised, and nothing contained in this Act may be construed to impair, in 17any way, the validity of any bonds that may have been issued by the County under the authority of any said Acts, and the validity of the bonds is hereby ratified, confirmed, 18 and approved. This Act, being necessary for the welfare of the inhabitants of Calvert 19 20County, shall be liberally construed to effect the purposes hereof. All Acts and parts of 21Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed to the extent of 22such inconsistency.

23 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 24 effect June 1, 2008.
