18 19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 23	(A) Except as provided in § 24–505 of this subtitle, [beginning on February 1, 2008,] a person may not smoke in:



1	(1) An indoor area open to the public;
2 3	(2) An indoor place in which meetings are open to the public in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 5 of the State Government Article;
4 5	(3) A government-owned or government-operated means of mass transportation including buses, vans, trains, taxicabs, and limousines; or
6	(4) An indoor place of employment.
7 8	(B) A PERSON MAY NOT SMOKE A TOBACCO PRODUCT IN A VEHICLE IN WHICH A PERSON WHO IS UNDER THE AGE OF 6 YEARS IS A PASSENGER.

10 11 12	(a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section and except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a person who violates a provision of this subtitle or a regulation adopted under § 24–507(a) of this subtitle:
13 14	(1) For a first violation, shall be issued a written reprimand by the Secretary or the Secretary's designee;
15	(2) For a second violation, is subject to a civil penalty of \$100; and
16 17	(3) For each subsequent violation, is subject to a civil penalty not less than \$250.
18 19	(b) The Secretary may waive a penalty established under subsection (a) of this section, giving consideration to factors that include:
20	(1) The seriousness of the violation; and
21 22	(2) Any demonstrated good faith measures to comply with the provisions of this subtitle.
23 24 25	(f) A penalty collected by the Secretary under this section shall be paid to the Cigarette Restitution Fund established under § 7–317 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
26 27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
