A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Municipal Corporations - Building Excise Tax

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing municipal corporations to impose, by ordinance or resolution, a building excise tax on all types of building construction within a 4 municipal corporation; requiring the governing body of a municipal corporation 5 to hold a public hearing before adopting a certain ordinance or resolution; 6 7 prohibiting a municipal corporation from imposing a building excise tax if the municipal corporation imposes a certain impact fee; requiring a municipal 8 9 corporation to specify in the ordinance or resolution the types of building 10 construction subject to tax, the criteria and formulas used to calculate and assess the tax, and the tax rates; authorizing a municipal corporation to impose 11 different rates of the building excise tax on different types of building 12 13 construction subject to the tax; requiring that the building excise tax be assessed on an applicant for a building permit at the time of the issuance of the 14 building permit; requiring that the tax rates relate to the development or 15 growth-related infrastructure needs in the municipal corporation; authorizing a 16 municipal corporation to provide for tax credits against and exemptions from 17 the building excise tax; requiring that the revenues from the building excise tax 18 be deposited in a special fund; providing that the revenues from the building 19 excise tax may only be used for certain capital costs of certain public works, 20 improvements, and facilities; and generally relating to authorizing municipal 21 22 corporations to impose a building excise tax.

- 25 (D) (1) A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION MAY IMPOSE DIFFERENT RATES

- 28 (2) THE TAX RATES IMPOSED SHALL RELATE TO THE

6	(I) STREETS, ROADS, BRIDGES, AND RELATED
7	INFRASTRUCTURE;
8	(II) PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES;
9	(III) STORM DRAIN FACILITIES;
10	(IV) WATER AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITIES;
11	(V) WATER AND WASTEWATER MAINTENANCE AND
12	RELATED INFRASTRUCTURE;
13	(VI) EMERGENCY SERVICES;
14	(VII) DEBT REDUCTION RELATED TO EXPENDITURES FOR
15	CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS; AND
16	(VIII) OTHER MUNICIPAL FACILITIES.
17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18	July 1, 2008.
