Vehicle Laws - Motor Vehicle Accident Reports - Access

FOR the purpose of authorizing a member of the Maryland General Assembly to 3 access a motor vehicle accident report under certain circumstances; providing 4 that a designated employee of a law enforcement agency may be presented with $\mathbf{5}$ 6 certain documentation under certain circumstances; exempting certain entities 7 that may access motor vehicle accident reports from a requirement that they 8 present certain documentation to an officer or designated employee of a law 9 enforcement agency; making a certain violation related to disclosing a motor vehicle accident report a misdemeanor; making stylistic changes prohibiting a 10 person from accessing a certain motor vehicle accident report for certain 11 purposes under certain circumstances; providing for a certain penalty; repealing 12 certain provisions of law concerning access to and disclosure of a certain motor 13 vehicle accident report; defining certain terms; making this Act an emergency 14 measure; and generally relating to motor vehicle accident reports. 15

1(c)Except as provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this section, a person who2violates any provision of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is3subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 5 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 6 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 7 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 8 the date it is enacted.
