Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System – Membership – Retired Pilots with the Maryland State Police

- 4 FOR the purpose of providing certain retirees who are reemployed by the Maryland 5 State Police Aviation Command as helicopter pilots with membership in the 6 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; making membership in the Law 7 Enforcement Officers' Pension System a condition of employment for certain 8 retirees of the State Police Retirement System; providing a certain exception for 9 certain retirees of the State Police Retirement System who are reemployed as Maryland State Police Aviation Command helicopter pilots; allowing certain 10 members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System to purchase service 11 credit for certain periods of employment at a certain rate; requiring that certain 12 members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System who purchase 13 service credit to complete and file certain forms; and generally relating to 14 pension benefits for certain retired pilots who are reemployed by the Maryland 15 State Police Aviation Command. 16
