A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Certified Associate Counselor-Alcohol and Drug – Qualifications

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists to waive a certain requirement that an applicant for a certificate to practice as an associate counselor-alcohol and drug complete a certain number of hours of supervised experience in alcohol and drug counseling after the award of a bachelor's degree if the applicant has obtained certain experience approved by the Board; and generally relating to qualifications for certified associate counselors-alcohol and drug.

19 (A) To qualify as a certified associate counselor-alcohol and drug an 20 applicant shall:

(1) Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited educational institution
 approved by the Board in a health or human services counseling field or have
 completed a program of studies judged by the Board to be substantially equivalent in
 subject matter and extent of training to such a program of studies;

1 (2) Have completed not less than 3 years, with a minimum of 2,000 2 hours of supervised experience in alcohol and drug counseling approved by the Board, 3 2 years of which shall have been completed after the award of the bachelor's degree;

4 (3) Have a minimum of 20 credit hours in alcohol and drug counselor 5 training as defined in § 17–302.3(d)(4) of this subtitle; and

6 (4) (i) Practice alcohol and drug counseling under the supervision 7 of a certified professional counselor–alcohol and drug or another health care provider 8 approved by the Board; or

9 (ii) Provide alcohol and drug counseling as an employee of an 10 agency or facility that is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of 11 Healthcare Organizations or that is certified under Title 8, Subtitle 4 of the Health – 12 General Article.
